Help Wanted!!

Are you looking for a unique and rewarding job opportunity? The Retreat Center is hiring kitchen support staff to serve the many wonderful retreat groups who stay with us. The schedule can vary based on size of retreat group and duration of stay, but shifts are primarily weekends (day or evening) and a few weekdays. Day shifts are typically 6×10^{-2} P.M. and afternoon evening 10^{-2} P.M. to 10^{-2} P.M. and afternoon evening 10^{-2} P.M. to 10^{-2} P.M.

Kitchen:

We are seeking one individual with at least one year experience in food prep and service to work as a pair to the lead cook scheduled on shift. Basic prep tasks, set-up, drink service, assistance serving in the food line and cleaning/sanitation of the kitchen and dining area after a meal are some of the duties assigned to the role.

Kitchen:

The second position is for a shift lead to prepare the planned menu, run the serving line, and be responsible for dining and kitchen area, including support staff, in areas of sanitation and safety regulation. Individual must be able to follow Ohio food safety regulation for prepping and serving food and storage. ServSafe certification preferred, but not required.

Guest Services:

The Retreat Center is also seeking an individual to join our Guest Services team. Guest Assistants may greet arriving retreatants, collect retreat payment, ensure accommodations are appropriate, facilitate building use, ring out gift shop purchases, assist in the dining area and answer any inquires as they arise. Hours are primarily weekends and vary between day/evening based on each retreat's needs.

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Five fast facts about Our Lady of the Vines Retreat Center:

- In 1869 Lewis Leppelman purchased the land on which the Retreat Center stands and built a French second empire mansion on the property. Lewis had taken over his father Edward's Fremont jewelry business in 1854.
- · In 1893, Charles J. Green purchased the estate and named it Evergreen Hill. The Green's did major renovation on the house, including installing beautiful chandeliers and building fireplaces and a ballroom.
- Sisters Bernardine McMullen and Anthony McMullen came from Grand Rapids, MI to Tiffin, OH in 1912, at the request of Bishop Joseph Schrembs to build and operate a hospital.
- As the order grew into serving hospitals and schools in the area, the Sisters of Mercy purchased the Green house in 1925 to serve as a motherhouse and novitiate to train young Sisters for the order in the Toledo Diocese. Newspapers articles state the Sisters became owners of the house and fifty-nine acres of land for \$50,000. The Sisters officially moved in on October 7, 1926.
- The Sisters of Mercy Motherhouse, now Our Lady of the Pines Retreat Center, sees approximately 5,000 people come through its doors on an annual basis.
